Four things that will decide Monday's match

Monday 28 September 2026 · Away fixture in Tunisia

01 · THE LAST 15 MINUTES**Two points slipped away late in Tripoli**

The Zebras led Libya 2–0 at half-time, then conceded after the 85th minute and again from a stoppage-time penalty.

02 · AWAY IN TUNISIA**Botswana have won in Tunisia before**

A 1–0 win there in 2010. Tunisia won the other three home meetings, but drew at home to Uganda on Thursday.

03 · THE COUNTER**Uganda showed how to hurt Tunisia**

Their equaliser in Radès came from a quick counter after winning the ball outside the box.

04 · PENALTIES**Keep it clean in the box**

Libya's equaliser was a penalty, and 2 of Tunisia's 7 AFCON 2025 goals were penalties.

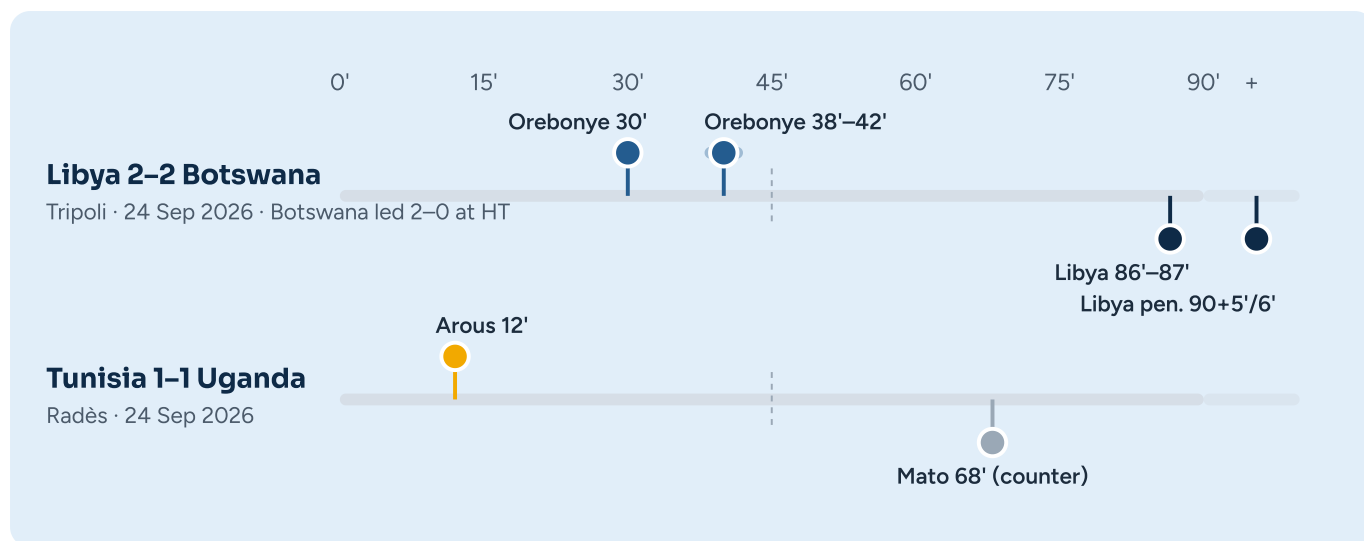
Everyone is level, so Monday's winner leads the group

Both teams let a lead slip on Thursday

Botswana scored twice in the first half in Tripoli and held on until the final minutes. Tunisia scored early at home and were pegged back in the second half. Neither side has yet shown it can close out a game in this group.

Orebonye (amber) scored both goals.

What worked. Orebonye scored twice before half-time, with assists reported for Kgamanyane and Kopelang. The front three created enough to win away from home.

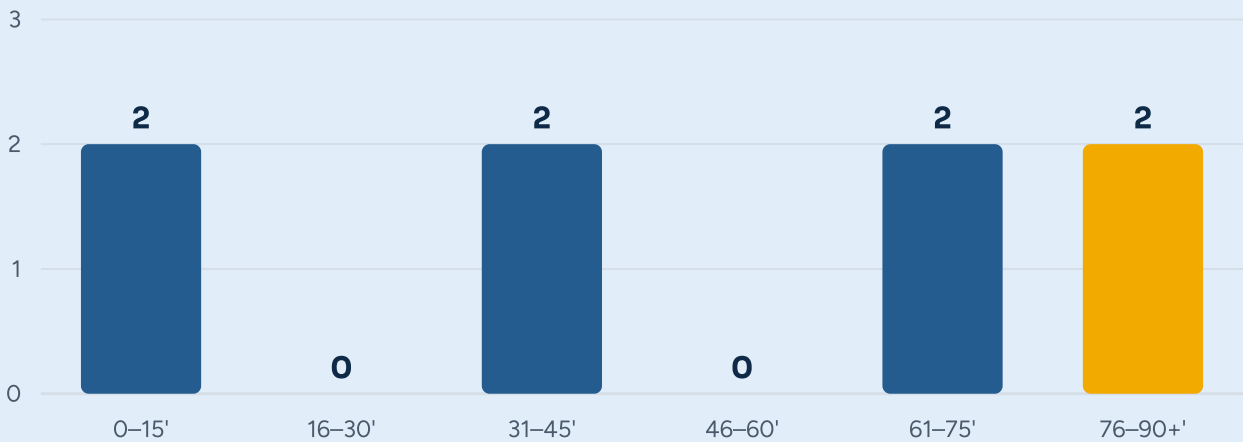
What went wrong. Libya's two goals came after the 85th minute, the second from a penalty in stoppage time. The lead was lost in the final ten minutes, not in open play over the whole half.

Discipline. Kopelang was booked in the 14th minute. Cheap early bookings for defenders are a risk against a side that attacks until the end.

Tunisia score at any point in a match

Across AFCON 2025 and Thursday's qualifier, Tunisia scored 8 goals in 5 matches. They were spread evenly: 4 in each half, including 2 in the last 15 minutes.

How Uganda got back in. In the second half Uganda pressed higher and disrupted Tunisia's build-up. Their 68th-minute equaliser came from a quick counter after winning the ball outside the box, finished with a long-range strike.

Penalties matter. Tunisia scored 2 penalties at AFCON 2025 (Gharbi 43' vs Tanzania, Abdi 87' vs Nigeria).

Late goals. Talbi 74' and Abdi 87' vs Nigeria, and Chaouat 88' vs Mali. Tunisia keep pushing to the end.

HEAD TO HEAD

Tunisia are strong at home, but Botswana have won there

Tunisia have won 4 of the 8 meetings, Botswana 2, with 2 draws. In Tunisia, the hosts have won three of four meetings, scoring 9 goals, but Botswana won 1–0 there in 2010.

KEYS FOR THE ZEBRAS

Four decisions for Monday

- 1 Plan the last 15 minutes before kick-off**
Decide substitutions and the shape for protecting a lead in advance, and bring fresh legs on before the 75th minute rather than after.
- 2 Stay compact and patient away from home**
Tunisia have won three of four home meetings. Keep the game tight: a draw in Tunisia would be a good result, and Botswana have won there before.
- 3 Hit Tunisia in transition**
Press their build-up at chosen moments, then release quickly towards Orebonye and the wide forwards, as Uganda did on Thursday.
- 4 Defend the box without lunging**
No rash challenges late on. One penalty already cost two points in Tripoli.



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
